Chair Richard Wrench called the meeting to order.

Dr. Garvey verified that the meeting was properly posted pursuant to § 19.84(1) Wis. Statutes.

This year's focus is on personalized learning. Melissa shared the nine representatives that are going to be invited to represent Johnson Creek in grades 7th-12th as well as the two district chaperones. The team will come to curriculum meeting in March to share out their experience and proposal.

Lisa Krohn shared MS Exploratory past and present. Where we are now and the goal is to provide students with the most CTE course exposures prior to HS as well as give them a voice and choice in pathways of interest.

The next meeting will be February 8, 2017. It will be held in the District Board Room at 7:15 a.m. and focus on MS Exploratory Pathway with a student showcase of two course selections from Quarter 2.
