The students stated that many high school teachers use lecture as their main instructional practice. The students also pointed out that some teachers in high school don't seem to really have a plan from one day to the next and students don't know what the purpose or end goal is.

The administrators and Committee members discussed the 2017 summer professional development focus. Much of the focus will be on personalized learning at the high school level.
