

Parents' Rights and the Curriculum

The Board of Education recognizes the right of parents or guardian to inspect instructional materials and to deny their child's participation in certain curricular activities in accordance with state and federal laws and regulations. The board also recognizes that reasonable accommodations with regard to examinations and other academic requirements may have to be made from time to time because of a student's religious beliefs. Moreover, parent or guardian of a child may request all library records relating to the use of the library's documents or other materials, resources, or services by the child.

Requests regarding the above may be made to the building principal. All requests shall be judged individually, based upon state and federal guidelines. If a parent/guardian is not satisfied with the building principal's decision, he/she may appeal to the district administrator and if necessary the school board.

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
