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Parent Involvement in Title I Programs

The School District of Johnson Creek is committed to the goal of providing quality education for every child in the District. It is the desire of the District to establish partnerships with parents and with the community. Everyone gains if school and home work together to promote high achievement by students. Parents play an extremely important role as children's first teachers. Their support for their children and for the school is critical to their children's success at every step along the way.

In accordance with the requirements of P.L. 107-110 Every Student Succeeds Act, the following identifies parent involvement strategies as related to the Title I program in the School District of Johnson Creek.

- A. Parents shall be involved in the development of the Title I Program plan;
- B. Meetings will be scheduled with parents in a flexible manner so as to better facilitate their attendance;
- C. Meetings will be held that include review and explanation of the curriculum, means of assessment, and the proficiency levels students are expected to achieve and creation of parent/teacher student learning compacts;
- D. Parents shall be provided opportunities to formulate suggestions, interact and share experiences with other parents, and participate appropriately in the decision-making about the program and revisions in the Title I Program plan;
- E. Parents shall be involved in the monitoring, review, and evaluation of the Title I program through on-going communication and an annual meeting;
- F. Information concerning school performance profiles and a child's individual performance will be communicated to his/her parents;
- G. Parents shall be assisted in providing help to their children in achieving the objectives of the program by such means as ensuring regular attendance, monitoring television watching, providing adequate time and the proper environment for homework; guiding nutritional and health practices, etc.;
- H. A communication network that fosters home and school partnerships shall be developed and implemented. Such a network may include:

1. Media Notices
2. Pamphlets, Handbooks and Websites
3. School Performance Reports
4. Student Report Cards
5. Student Progress Reports
6. Parent/Teacher Conferences
7. Technology Conferencing (Telephone, Internet, etc.)
8. Surveys
9. Advisory Committees
- I. Other activities shall be developed on an on-going basis as appropriate to implementation of the program plan.

Parents of students participating in the Title I Program shall be informed annually of this policy and of the opportunities available for them to get involved in their child's educational program.
